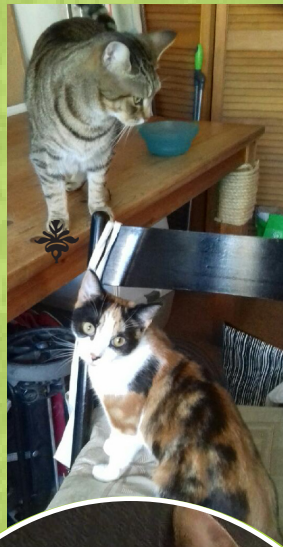

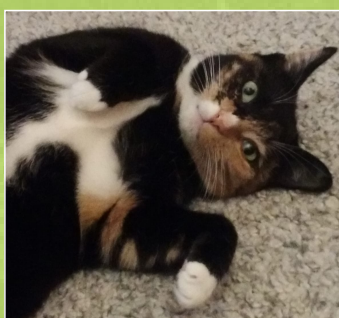
**Deacon** (right) enjoying a nap in his new home with Christine

**Kermit, (left) a lovable rogue who always wanted to be the centre of attention. Sadly missed after a sudden illness.**



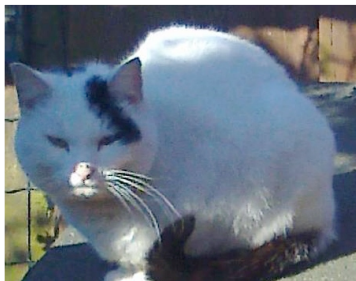
